
Santa Barbara Highway 101 Corridor Improvements Project

Santa Barbara County - Highway 101 - Post Mile 12.4/22.6



Description

The Santa Barbara Highway 101 Capital Preventative Maintenance (CAPM) project is located on Highway 101 from just south of Milpas St. to Fairview Ave. The project proposes to preserve just over 10 miles of existing pavement. It will also focus on drainage systems, dike replacement, rumble strips, roadside safety improvements, barrier, guardrail, and bridge rail upgrades, bridge restoration, roadside rehabilitation, sign panel replacement, curb ramp upgrades, bike lane and sidewalk widening, weigh in motion, and trash capture systems.

Purpose & Need

The purpose of this project is to extend the life and improve the ride quality of the existing pavement, Approve Proj. Report & Environ. Doc. Complete which is exhibiting surface distress. Upgrades to nonmotorized traffic facilities are needed to meet current standards, and improvements to drainage facilities will prevent further roadway and embankment damage. Roadside rehabilitation and safety elements will minimize maintenance worker exposure to traffic and hazardous conditions. In addition, two bridges have been identified as not meeting seismic and railing requirements.
