Subject: FY 2023 49 U.S.C §5307 and §5339 Program Funds Sub-allocations for Small Urbanized Areas

Dear MPO Executive Director:

Pursuant to 49 U.S.C. §5307 and §5339, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) apportions Urbanized Area Formula Program funds to urbanized areas (UZAs) and to states for public transportation capital projects, operating assistance, and transportation planning.

For these two programs the governor or the governor's designee performs the role of the designated recipient for UZAs under 200,000 in population (i.e., small UZAs). Caltrans is the small UZA governor's designee in California. As such, Caltrans may authorize another public entity to be a "direct recipient" and may work in partnership with MPO's to sub-allocate program funds that have been allocated for all small UZAs in California. To provide clarity regarding the distribution of FY 2023 FTA §5307 and §5339 program funds allocated to the small UZAs in California, please determine locally how the FY 2023 small UZA allocation(s) will be split among eligible direct recipients in your MPO's jurisdiction. Caltrans will require a written response (one letter) back from each MPO by May 15, 2023. The information in each MPO "split letter" must clearly, and definitively show how the UZA's apportionment is split among each of the direct recipients in their jurisdiction. This information will be compiled into one list and transmitted to FTA as the final, agreed upon statewide sub-allocations for the
