The ATRC provided a Disadvantaged Communities Technical Assistance (DAC TA) Program for Cycle 5. Local Government Commission (LGC) was selected as the technical assistance provider to work with applicants interested in applying for the ATP. LGC assisted ten disadvantaged community recipients throughout the state to prepare applications for ATP Cycle 5. Each recipient received a site-visit (two were in person, and the rest were virtual), multiple project discussion meetings, active transportation workshops, project scoping support, and application

feedback. Despite the challenges throughout the year, seven of the ten were able to submit applications, and the remaining three are receiving additional assistance to prepare for upcoming Cycle 6 or other funding opportunities. Three of the seven recipients were funded for nearly \$11.5 million.
